With sweeping coastal views, starry skies, and the sound of the surf as a backdrop, it's an unforgettable immersion in nature. The trip ends in charming St. Andrews-by-the-Sea, with an explorative sea kayak in the Fundy Isles, followed by a celebratory meal of regional fare.



## SOUTHWEST, NEW BRUNSWICK

# BELOVED BY THE ROOSEVELTS

The Southwest is where timeless coastal charm meets rich cultural heritage. On Campobello Island, tour the 34-room Roosevelt Cottage and walk the trails of Roosevelt Campobello International Park—the summer retreat of Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt.

Nearby, the iconic seaside town of St. Andrews by-the-Sea offers historic streets, boutique shops, and fine dining, all anchored by the legendary Algonquin Resort. Set out on a whale-watching adventure or explore Ministers Island at low tide, where a sandbar road leads to the former summer estate of Canadian railway baron Sir William Van Horne.

Off the coast, the Fundy Isles Archipelago—Campobello, Deer Island, and Grand Manan—invite exploration by kayak through clear waters teeming with seals, porpoises, and sea birds. Whether paddling the coastline, strolling garden paths, or watching the tides shape the shore, the Southwest reveals the quiet magic that makes New Brunswick unforgettable.











## SAINT JOHN REGION

## URBAN ENERGY, NATURAL RHYTHM

Saint John blends vibrant city culture with Fundy's raw, natural beauty. Visitors can explore sprawling Rockwood Park—one of the largest urban parks in North America—with its freshwater lakes, forest trails, and year-round recreation. Just minutes away, the coastal paths of Irving Nature Park offer sweeping views of the Bay, where seals, seabirds, and salty breezes are part of the daily rhythm.

Down at the harbourfront, the award-winning Area 506 Container Village buzzes with concerts, artisan boutiques, and bold local flavour. History buffs will love the heritage, architecture, and market traditions, while foodies will find Saint John's culinary scene both surprising and satisfying—where Maritime roots meet modern creativity. With history, creativity, and nature all just steps apart, Saint John is a gateway to authentic Atlantic Canada—closer than you think, and far from ordinary.









## **GATEWAY TO THE FUNDY TRAIL**

Tucked along the dramatic Bay of Fundy coastline, St. Martins is a charming village where tides rule the day.

Famous for its red sea cliffs, wave-sculpted caves, bird-filled skies, and star filled nights, it's also the western gateway to the Fundy Trail Provincial Park. Twice daily, lobster boats rise and fall with the world's highest tides in a harbour framed by two covered bridges, a lighthouse, and maritime hospitality.

Once a shipbuilding hub, now a peaceful retreat—this is coastal New Brunswick at its most photogenic.
